#### From the Dean

Greetings all. We are now in the period known as "Lent" to some of us in denominations that observe the 40s days prior to Easter as such. For some it means giving "up" something to make us more spiritual or more penitent. I remember a priest once telling me that he didn't give up, he took on. In mulling on that I wonder if perhaps, "taking on" would be more likely to give me self examination.

Maybe I need to practice more. Maybe I should learn new repertoire. Maybe I can expand my knowledge something particularly germane to my work as a Cathedral organist. Lent is, in the Catholic faith at least, a time of lessened demands musically. All focus is directed towards Holy Week and Easter.

Having just had a wonderful repertoire session with Antone Godding, I have picked out a few new things I enjoyed and want to obtain for my library. Now is the time to commit to this effort! I challenge each of us to "take on" for Lent.

And speaking of taking on, both a challenge and an invitation await our guild members. The chapter's endowment for the artist fund is now accepting donations. Founded in 1998, this money has been set aside to grow and provide underwriting to the costs of providing chapter funding. We are currently soliciting money for the artist endowment fund which can be used in the upcoming years. Interest from this fund will soon be available to underwrite some of our concert costs.

In addition, I challenge our members to consider a "pledge" on a monthly basis to assist in the programming of fine organ concerts in the coming year. As with the season of Lent when we give up something, (something which we know is not good for us!) I challenge us to take that Starbucks money, that cigarette money, that chocolate money, and pledge \$10, \$15, or \$20 a month to the guild's artist account. Perhaps you wish to have your money go to the endowment where it will become a permanent asset for our programming needs. Or perhaps you wish to have your money be part of the ongoing source of money to pay for immediate needs in its entirety.

I also wish to invite each of you to our March 13th meeting at St. Michael's Episcopal Church. A delightful evening of pipe organ and harpsichord music awaits you. My thanks to Elizabeth Plowman at St. Michael's for allowing us to conduct our meeting and program there. And special thanks to Timothy Allen, the new organist at Trinity Cathedral for being our duet artist who will perform in duet and alternation with me, your Dean.

Once again it is my pleasure to serve our chapter as Dean as we provide educational and artistic opportunities for our guild members as well as the musical community at large.
