Festival of the Senses Concert Honoring International Women's History Month

Composers Ethel Smyth, Florence Price, Nadia Boulanger, Jeanne Demessieux, and Fanny Hensel will be featured in "Written by Women," a Festival of the Senses organ concert by Rees Roberts at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 15, at St. Luke's Episcopal Church, 4106 JFK Boulevard in North Little Rock. The event, highlighting organ music written by women in recognition of International Women's History Month, is free and open to the public and is being cosponsored by the Central Arkansas Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Little Rock native Rees Roberts was music director, organist and choirmaster at St. Luke's for two and a half years before leaving to complete his Bachelor's degree at Arizona State University in Tempe, where he studied with Kimberly Marshall. He is now studying organ performance with Janette Fishell at the University of Indiana's Jacobs School of Music in Bloomington. After graduation from Little Rock's Central High School, he also studied at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music in Ohio with Jonathan Moyer and W. Webb Wiggins, and has played in master classes with Wilma Jensen in Memphis and Marie-Louise Langlais in Paris, France. He was a 2022 finalist in the National Competition in Organ Accompaniment sponsored by the Washington, D.C., chapter of the American Guild of Organists, of which he is a member.

The concert will be livestreamed at www.facebook.com/frcarey and will be available online afterward. Attendees at the live performance are asked to wear masks throughout the performance and to observe social distancing protocols.

Festival of the Senses is a performing arts series created by St. Luke's Episcopal Church in 2011 as a gift of the arts to the community to entertain, enlighten, and inspire. All events are free and open to the public, pandemic concerns permitting, and are livestreamed and posted afterward on St. Luke's Facebook website. Festival of the Senses performances are made possible by the generosity of audience members, donors, sponsors, and grants from the Arkansas Arts Council, an agency of the Department of Arkansas Heritage, and the National Endowment for the Arts.

Charles Russell

Charles Russell serves as Director of Parish Music at Grace Lutheran Church, Little Rock, AR, where he directs the Adult Choir and Handbell Choir, assists in worship planning and preparation of service materials, works with instrumentalists, and serves as organist.

He received the Bachelor of Arts degree with a double major in Parish Music and in History from Concordia University Wisconsin, Mequon, WI (2017). In December 2021, he completed the coursework to receive the Master of Church Music degree with a concentration in organ from Concordia University Wisconsin. He has studied organ with Dr. James Freese, Dr. Jess Anthony and Mr. Keith Williams.



Colin MacKnight

Colin MacKnight, called "a stunning player of exceptional ability" by composer and conductor Bob Chilcott, is Director of Music at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Little Rock, Arkansas. Prior to Trinity, Colin was Associate Organist at Cathedral of the Incarnation in Garden City, Long Island; Assistant Organist and Music Theory Teacher at St. Thomas Fifth Avenue; and Assistant Organist at Church of the Resurrection, NYC.

Colin received his bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees from The Juilliard School, studying organ performance with Paul Jacobs. For his dissertation "Ex Uno Plures: A Proposed Completion of Bach's Art of Fugue," Colin received the Richard F. French Doctoral Prize.

A frequent competition prize-winner, Colin's first prizes include the 2019 Paris Music Competition, 2017 West Chester University International Organ Competition, 2016 Albert Schweitzer Organ Competition, 2016 Arthur Poister Competition, 2015 NYC and Northeast Regional AGO competitions, M. Louise Miller Scholarship, 2013 Rodgers North American Classical Organ Competition, and Ruth and Paul Manz Organ Scholarship. Colin was also a laureate in the 2016 and 2019 Longwood Gardens International Organ Competitions.
