Biography of Graham Schultz

raham Schultz, originally from Fayetteville, Arkansas, Greceived his Bachelor of Music in organ performance from the Cleveland Institute of Music studying with Mr. Todd Wilson. Prior to studying in Cleveland, Graham attended the Interlochen Arts Academy where he studied with Mr. Thomas Bara and received the Fine Arts award in organ performance upon graduation. A dedicated church musician, Graham served for five years as the Organist and Choirmaster at St. James Church, Cleveland while also serving as an Assistant Organist at the parish of the Immaculate Conception in Cleveland as well. For four years he was the accompanist and director of the training choir for the Ohio Boychoir. In 2010, Mr. Schultz accompanied the Choir of St. Paul's Church, Fayetteville, Arkansas for a residency at Durham Cathedral in England. In February of 2011, he served as organist for The Cathedral Choir of Men and Boys during their residency at Hereford Cathedral, England. He is currently Assistant Organist at Church of the Incarnation in Dallas, Texas.

Mr. Schultz's program will include works by Mendelssohn, Bairstow, Buxtehude, Duruflé, and Langlais.

m obert}$ Young Ellis was Professor of Organ at Henderson State University in Arkadelphia for 35 years from 1952 to 1987. It is hoped that this series will inspire musicians young and old, as Ellis, through his teaching and playing, influenced innumerable students and colleagues who remember him as a musician of genius and as one who brought both wit and sophistication to the lesson and to the classroom. Mr. Ellis, a native of Fort Worth, Texas, was trained at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, at the University of North Texas and at the University of Michigan. He was guest artist for numerous conventions of the American Guild of Organists and for dedications of many new pipe organ installations throughout the United States. Mr. Ellis was a visiting lecturer at Westminster Choir College of Rider University in Princeton, New Jersey. In Arkansas, he served as organist for the First United Methodist Church of Hot Springs and the First United Methodist Church of Arkadelphia. At Henderson, he coached four Fulbright scholars and winners of regional and national competitions. He was a man of warm presence and kindness to all who knew him. Those whom he influenced are professionals now serving throughout the country as church musicians, university professors, organ builders, and as principals and supporters for arts organizations.

Winner of the Arthur Poister Scholarship Competition in Organ Playing 2011, Albert Schweitzer Organ Competition 2009, West Chester (PA) University's Ninth Annual International Organ Competition, called "our rising star" by the Charleston, SC chapter of the American Guild of Organists, and named a Young Organ Virtuoso, Adam Pajan is beginning his doctoral work at the University of Oklahoma's American Organ Institute as a graduate assistant and Fellow of the Graduate College. He recently completed his Master of Music in Organ Performance and Certificate in Church Music Studies at the Yale University School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music. While at Yale, he garnered top honors as the recipient of the Robert Baker Scholarship, Julia R. Sherman Prize for "excellence in organ playing," Richard Paul DeLong Prize for being "the student whose work best exemplifies the dedication and the use of those special gifts required of practicing church musicians," and was awarded the 2009-2010 Ruth and Paul Manz Scholarship, granted through the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. He graduated Magna cum laude from Furman University in Greenville, SC in 2008 with a Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance.
