A Message from the Dean

Hello all. We are excited about the coming year. Our Executive Committee and Programming Committee have worked diligently over the summer to craft new ideas for drawing people to the organ as well as new ideas on education and audiences for the organ.

Programming will include a mix of organ repertoire, anthem repertoire, choral events and organ concerts.

Part of that which makes a successful organization is the ability to have a public presence in the community which we serve. Many of our membership have been recruited to muster those within their own denominations and affiliations.

I am so proud and excited by our denominational team leaders in their many hours of phone calling and writing and mailing to prospective new members. We hope to include more folks into the ranks of us who make music in church.

The two things that distinguish us as a "guild" are both the sponsorship of concerts as well as the teaching or mentoring as an institution of skilled professionals which we can provide to others.

In that vein I am thrilled that we have now in place an educational liaison, Dr. Kay McAfee, to devise traditional and non-traditional learning opportunities for folks seeking to learn about service playing, as well as improved organ prowess in general.

Our expanded programming will require additional funding sources beyond the traditional source of membership dues. Looking ahead we will actively campaign for: 1. A standing concert fund, much as we see in symphony, opera and ballet concerts; 2. Programming donations in order to bring in more outside programming for monthly meetings; and 3. Endowment donations for the purpose of long-term yield in the funding of the concerts we want to offer our community.

As I reflect upon my own initiation into a career as an organist, many of my first experiences as a teenager were upon the Wurlitzer theater organ. I suppose much of my enthusiasm was generated by popular music upon the organ, with disciplined study coming later. As we seek to attract new audiences let us all reflect upon how we came to do our work as church musicians, seeking to find new ways to attract the new generation of organ aficionados.

Our September meeting will include the installation of officers followed by an anthem reading session with anthems provided by various members representing different denominations and styles. We invite you to invite guests to this meeting! Bring your choir director/pianists/accompanists/pastors so that more church staff can know of the existence of and assistance available from the Central Arkansas Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.
