From the Dean

Greetings Friends!

It is with a spirit of gratitude that I assume the duty of serving you all as the incoming Dean of the Central Arkansas Chapter American Guild of Organists.

Many thanks to you all for extending me this honor as together we continue our mission to foster enthusiasm and support—both among our ranks and in the central Arkansas community—for organ music and organ playing, not only by offering regular concert events to the general public, but also by making available opportunities for continuing education in our field and by outreach education to inspire the hearts of young people to discover the joy of making music at the organ.

We are not members of the Guild to celebrate ourselves and our own achievements, or to boast of our musical pedigrees. As the pendulum of worship in all faith traditions swings, we face significant challenges in many places to the survival of our art and of our vocation in service to God, God's people, and the liturgy. It is crucial then that we use the tools we have been entrusted by our teachers, mentors, and spiritual leaders to ensure that what we do every day as organists continues for generations to come, that the heritage of hundreds of years of accompanying worship—of which we are the current custodians—does not vanish, when, inevitably, we ourselves must leave.

That we are an endangered species—primarily on the parish level—is not news. Neither is the fact, although we may be reluctant to admit it, that much of our situation is a product of our own making.

AGO national is also aware of this, and, serving now in my second year on the AGO national marketing committee, I can tell you that there is on-going, real-time, and active discussion and planning in strategies to transform our public perception to make our organization more appealing, open, and welcoming to new members, especially to young musicians and a diverse host of supporters of organ music and the arts in general—after all, it is our supporters (parishioners) whom

we serve, to whom we owe our gratitude, truly, for the privilege of sitting on our benches. To borrow the metaphor made famous by Pope John XXIII, our organization wishes to "open the windows and let the fresh air of the Spirit blow through."

This is particularly vital to us now, the Guild of the post-pandemic era, when by circumstance, so much has changed and transformed. I am grateful for the leadership, new ideas, and forwardly directed outlook of my predecessor, Dean Bob Bidewell, who navigated us adroitly through the years of lockdown with the clear message that Guild membership matters and most especially that collegial cooperation and collaboration, mutual encouragement, kindness, and inclusion matter. And friends, these are the same qualities I will continue to foster moving forward. And I am confident our new officers and executive committee-most of them new faces in chapter leadership—share in the same. For these are the qualities that will ensure that the AGO remains relevant in the years ahead.
